

SEKGA Roundup Sale Rules

General Information

- 1) The Sale will be limited to a maximum of 112 animals.
- 2) There will be 3 divisions of goats; 100% New Zealand, Purebred, Percentage
- 3) Requests for sale spaces will open February 1 and close when 102 does and 10 bucks are reached.
- 4) All consignors must be members in good standing of the SEKGA, with dues up to date at the time consignment forms are mailed in.
- 5) All goats consigned must be at least **6 months old (DOB by 12-22-2018)** on sale day, except for nursing kids. No animals over 5 years old will be allowed.
- 6) All goats must have the **consignor's prefix** as the breeder. The maximum number of animals any one member can consign is 3 does unless invited to consign a larger amount. **Only one consignment per household** will be accepted.
- 7) Three does must be consigned to consign one buck. Bucks will be picked by a lottery system after consignments are closed.
- 8) Does with nursing kids are considered as one unit.
- 9) Every 100% New Zealand and Purebred must be DNA tested by sale day.
- 10) The payment of a \$50.00 consignment fee, per sale space requested, must accompany each consignment request.
- 11) Pen fees are \$10 per animal. Bucks and does will be placed one animal per pen.
- 12) The \$50.00 per head consignment fee will not be refunded for any reason.
- 13) A committee will be in place to reject any animal deemed not acceptable for the sale. **Entries must have only 1+1 teats, and hooves trimmed. This is a breeding stock sale. All goats must be of top quality. Remember, you are advertising your farm.**
- 14) There will be no private goat sales at the facility during the time it is rented by the SEKGA.
- 15) SEKGA is not responsible for the health or pedigree information of the animals in the sale.
- 16) All agreements or guarantees are between the buyer and the seller.
- 17) All goats are sold as is, and become the property of the buyer at the drop of the gavel.
- 18) The consignor must be in good standing with the registry or association in which he lists his/her goat.
- 19) Whatever registry the consigned goat is listed in, the buyer has the choice as to which registry the goat is transferred into.

Consignments

- 1) Consignor's information sheet I and sheet II must be completed by each consignor and sent to the Sales Manager as specified.
 - a. Consignment sheet I must be mailed to the sale manager on or after February 1. No entries postmarked before February 1 can be accepted. Consignments will close as soon as the maximum number of goats is reached. If more than 112 animals are consigned, going by the postmark on the date consignments are closed, all consignor's names will be put in a lottery and drawn one at a time. The names drawn will have one goat eliminated from the sale, until the number of goats does not exceed the maximum.
 - b. Consignment sheet II must be mailed along with copies of the registration papers by April 15. Pictures of your animals must be emailed by this date to be included in catalog.
- 2) All goats 6 months old or older, consigned to the Sale, must be NKR, AKGA, or IKGA registered. All nursing kids must have either a registration certificate or application for registration, with DNA if 100% NZ or Purebred.
- 3) All consigned animals must be registered in the consignor's name.
- 4) Sufficient time must be allowed to get the DNA completed. Paperwork needs to be sent in to the registrar by April 1.
- 5) A substitution for a consigned animal will be allowed if the original animal becomes ill, injured or dies before sale date.
- 6) All checks for animals sold will be mailed to consignors as soon as all checks for purchased goats are cleared.
- 7) Bucks for the sale will be picked by a lottery system after consignments are closed if more than 10 bucks are consigned. Ten bucks will be randomly picked for the sale. Members will only be allowed to sell one buck a year, between the two SEKGA sales.

Animal Check-In

- 1) Upon unloading, consignors will present the following documents in separate manila envelopes for each animal:
 - A) Original Registration
 - B) Copy of Registration
 - C) A copy of the official interstate health certificate issued within 30 days of the sale.
 - D) Filled out and signed transfer form
 - E) A completed and signed sire declaration form, if the doe has been exposed.
- 2) The original health certificate will be handed in to the Sale Manager, to keep for the state inspector.

3) All consignors must have the paperwork and their manila envelopes totally filled out and ready to hand to the Sale Manager. No goats will be unloaded until the paperwork is checked out. If their envelopes are not ready, they will be ineligible to participate in the next sale. Check-in goes much smoother if everyone has done their part.

Identification

- 1) Every goat consigned must have ear tags and **readable** tattoos or microchips **that correspond to their registration certificate.**
- 2) Any consignor using microchips for an animal's personal identification must provide their own reader to help identify/verify each animal's identity.
- 3) Nursing kids 90 days and younger as of sale date must have an ear tag number and microchip or tattoo that corresponds to their registration certificate or application for registration and transfer.
- 6) All animals, including nursing kids, **must have a state or federal scrapies tag in their ear.**

Load out

- 1) No animal will be removed from the barn without a release form from the office.
- 2) Release forms will be issued when all accounts have been settled.
- 3) No animals will be loaded until the sale has ended

Commissions and Charges.

- 1) All sales transactions concerning goats consigned to the sale must go through the office.
- 2) A commission of 10%, minimum of \$50, will be charged on all animals consigned to and sold at the sale.
- 3) A commission of 10%, minimum of \$50, will be charged on the final bid offered on any animal that the consignor chooses to "No Sale" during the auction.
- 4) The transfer fee on all goats sold will be deducted from the sale check for each animal sold at the sale.
- 5) The registration, DNA and transfer fees on all nursing 100% NZ or Purebred kids will be deducted from the sale check. Percentage kids do not need DNA, just registration and transfer.
- 6) Total consignment fees paid by a consignor will be deducted from the commission charged for selling their animals at the sale.
- 7) A pen charge of \$10 per animal will be deducted for all animals consigned.

Buyers

- 1) All buyers will be required to fill out a Buyer's Information form.
- 2) All buyers will have their driver's license photo copied when assigned a buyer's number.
- 3) All registration papers on goats paid for with a personal check will be held by the registrar until the check clears the bank.
- 4) Buyers and consignors accounts must be settled in the office before any animal can be removed from the barn.
- 5) Consignors that both sell and buy animals will have the amount of their purchases deducted from the amount of their sales. If there is a balance owed to the consignor, a check from the SEKGA will be issued to the consignor.
- 6) All guarantees of animals are between buyers and sellers. The SEKGA holds **NO** responsibility on any guarantees given by a consignor.

Payment

Payment may be made by one of five ways:

- A) Deduct from animals sold at sale
- B) Cash
- C) Money order
- D) Personal check
- E) Credit card (a service charge of up to 3.5 % may be added to the sale total)
